Introduction

The Registration Convention was opened for signature in 1975 and entered into force in 1976, 40 years ago. Since then 62 States have ratified the registration Convention (some States still register under UN General Assembly Resolution 1721 of 1961 and under Art. XI OST of 1967). This is far less than the 103 States party to the Outer Space Treaty so that further efforts should be undertaken to encourage all States to ratify the Convention. Efforts should also focus on implementing the provisions of the UN General Assembly Resolution on enhancing the practice of States and international intergovernmental organizations in registering space objects, which was passed unanimously in 2007. But it is not only States which register space objects; international intergovernmental organizations can also declare acceptance of the Registration Convention.

This Symposium will not provide history or a mere celebration – even though a celebration would be justified. The purpose of the Symposium is to present a critical assessment of what the current practical and concrete issues, questions and problems in the application of the Registration Convention are. With this, the Symposium tries to support the Legal Subcommittee in PROCEEDINGS OF THE INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE OF SPACE LAW 2016

identifying issues, which can be taken up in the session's debates and to provide background and analyses for these issues.
